### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

This holiday, I had the opportunity to fully embrace my mom hat, as two of my children played in holiday sporting tournaments. My son's water polo team entered their tournament as underdogs, a smaller squad with a few missing players. After two thrilling days, they made it to the semi-finals, which they narrowly lost. Then came the 3rd/4th playoff, and with just one second left on the clock, the score was tied at 2–2. The opposing team was awarded a 5m penalty.

As the goalkeeper's mom, my nerves were finished, and I immediately started praying for my boy. But then I noticed something that stilled my heart, the player stepping up to take the penalty was not their usual shooter, but a boy facing his first round of chemotherapy the very next day. This is why I love extracurricular activities for our children: they teach lessons that reach far beyond the classroom, lessons of courage, empathy, teamwork, and perspective. They remind us that sport is not only about winning or losing, but about the spirit of humanity that underpins it. The team knew he might miss, but they also knew that the opportunity for him to take that shot, to experience that moment, was more meaningful than the result itself. And he did it. With one second remaining, he scored. They won 3–2. And I have no doubt that my prayers for him wrapped around that pool with many others.

It reminded me that when I pray, I shouldn't pray for my desired outcome, because the outcome is already known. Instead, I must pray that His will be done, and align my heart with His purpose.

As we enter this concluding term of 2025 may our prayers and our actions alike echo this truth: "Thy will be done, O Lord."

May we, as a Fatima family, finish this year with grace, peace, and faith that whatever unfolds, it is already held in His hands.
